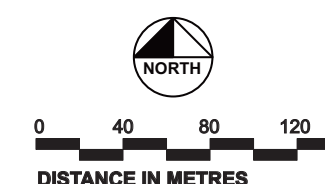

About Somerville

Located approximately 50km south-west of Melbourne, this family oriented township has all the conveniences anyone would want. With a long history of fruit growing Somerville has several historically significant buildings in its township that are still there today. The Somerville Post Office (which opened in 1870), the iconic Somerville Hotel (which dates back to the early 1900s), and the Mechanics Hall all form a part of the rich tapestry that is Somerville.

Introduction

Mornington Peninsula Shire is committed to planning for improved access for people who are older, less mobile and people with disabilities.

This mobility map has been produced by Mornington Peninsula Shire to assist electric scooter and wheelchair users to access healthy places and spaces, and participate in their local community.

Plan ahead for a safe journey

- Familiarise yourself with accessible footpaths in your area. Only travel on the road where a continuous path of travel is not available.
- When crossing the road, look for a pedestrian crossing or a place that has easy access with footpaths directly opposite each other.
- Familiarise yourself with Scooter RECHARGE locations.
- Carry a personal identification card with your emergency contact details, physical and medical information, the name of your doctor, etc.
- Take a mobile phone with you in case of an emergency.

Master Locksmith Access Key (MLAK)

The Master Locksmiths Access Key (MLAK) enables people with disabilities to gain access to a network of public facilities such as disability accessible toilets in Council municipalities and National Parks and to adaptive playground equipment (e.g. Liberty Swing) across Australia.

To obtain a MLAK key simply present a written letter from your doctor, disability support organisation or community health centre to a Master Locksmith.

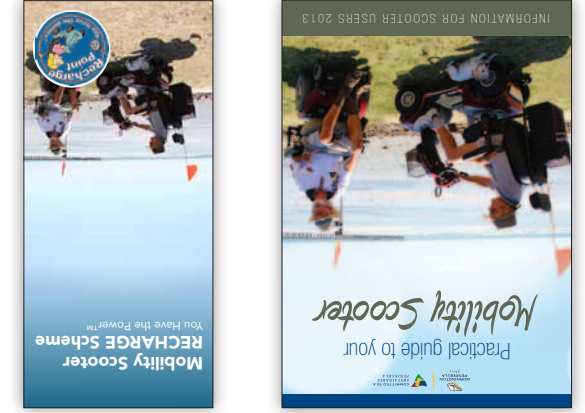

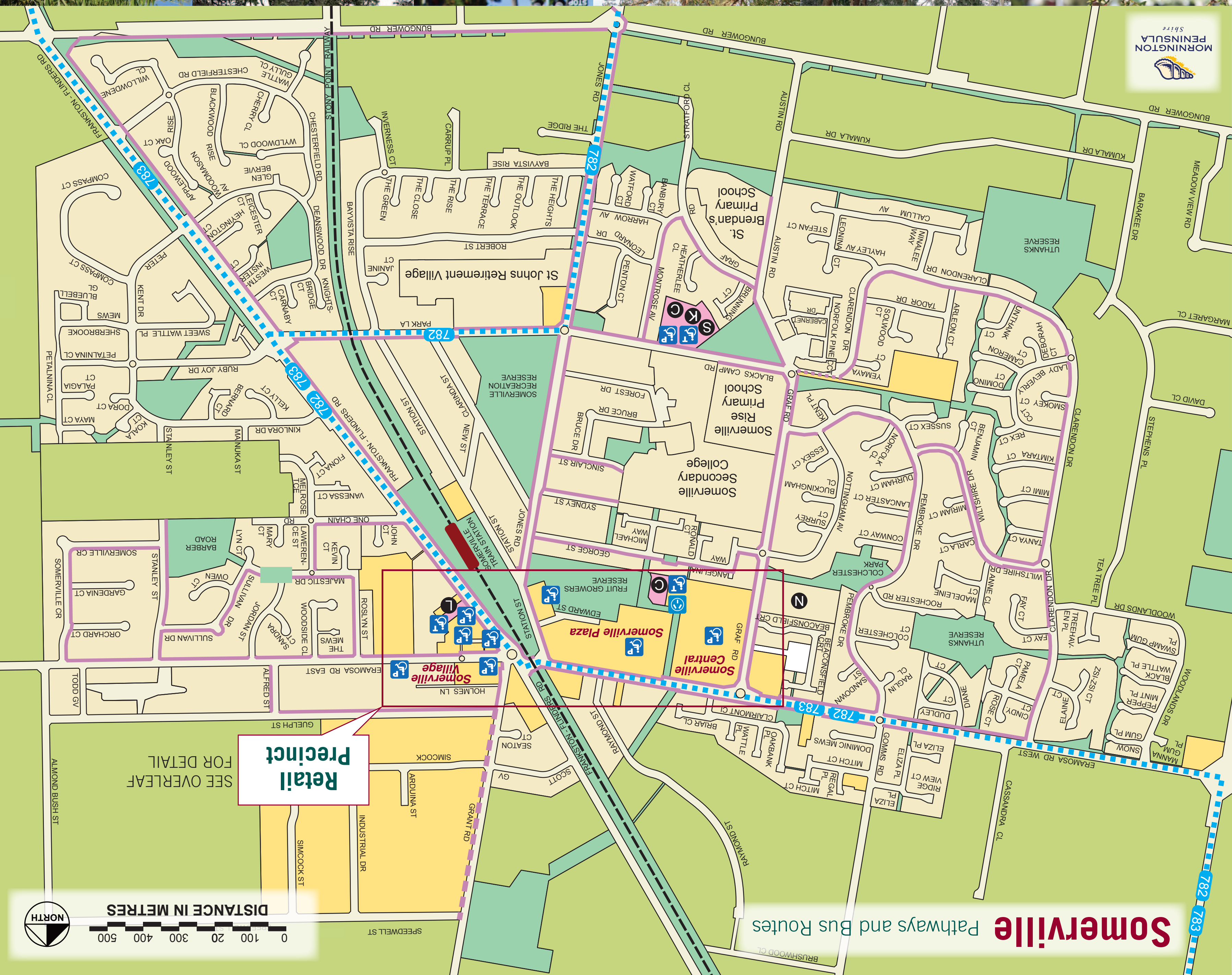
