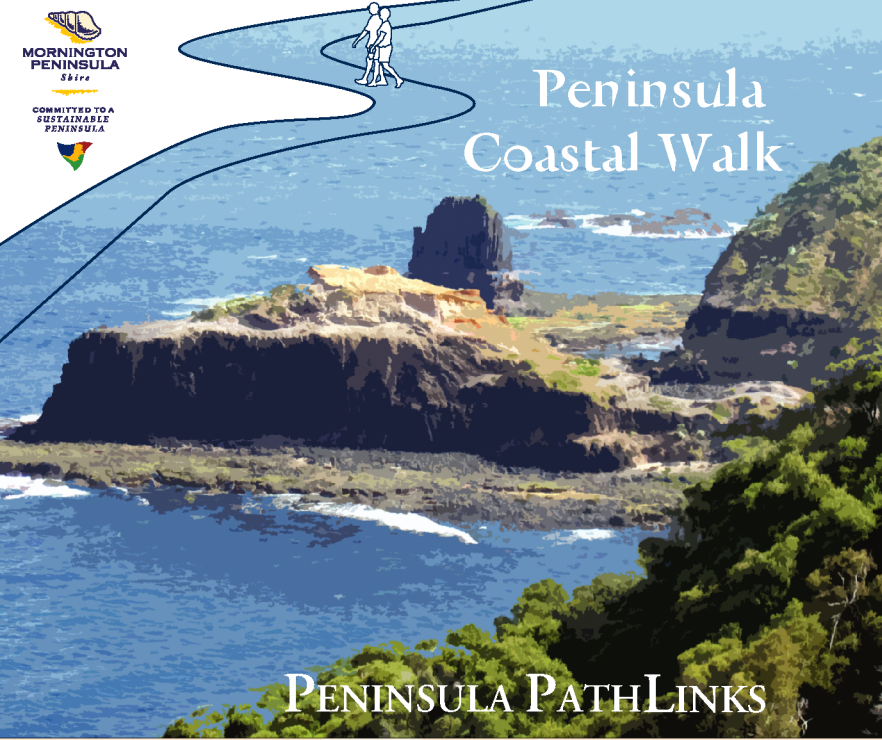




Peninsula Coastal Walk

Mornington Peninsula National Park extends along the southern coastline and Ocean Back Beach. It provides passive recreation opportunities such as fishing, walking, swimming, and sightseeing for the local community and wider region.

Walking tracks have been built along most of the coastline from London Bridge to Bushrangers Bay, and through Greens Bush. Coppins track, Farnsworth track and the Fingal Beach track are among the popular walking trails in this region. This maps show details for these trails - please seek further information for other areas along the coast.

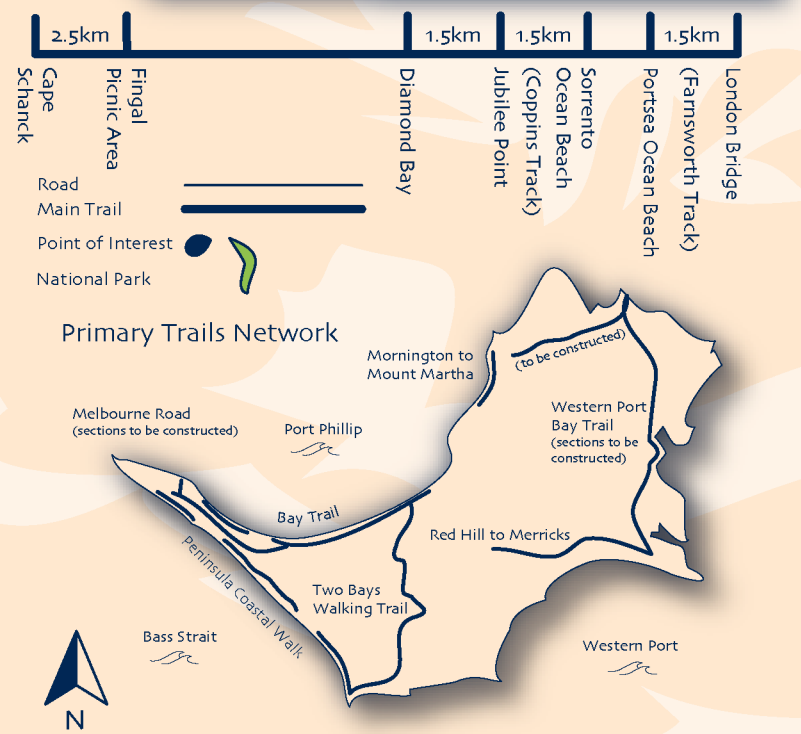
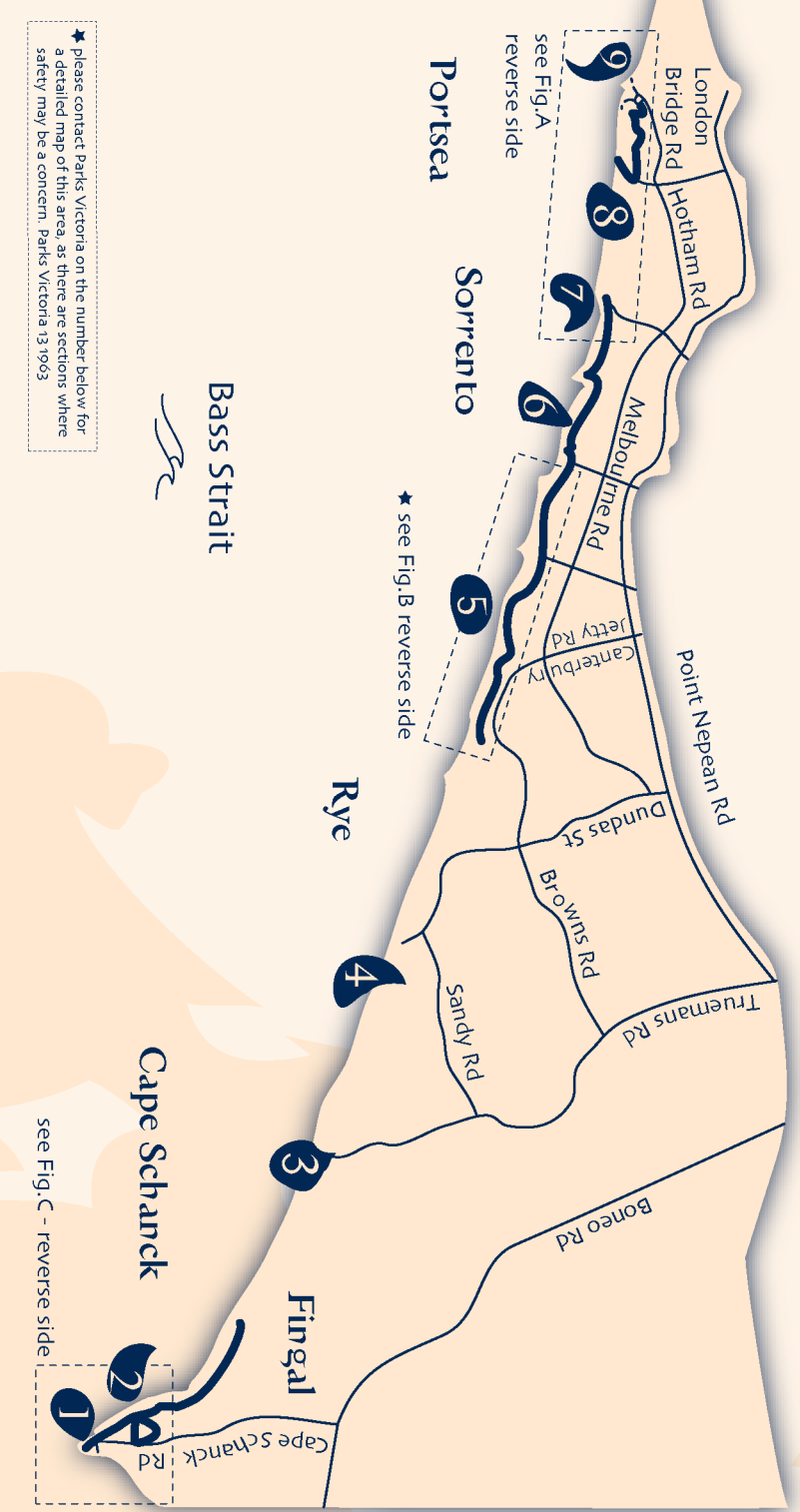
- **Fingal Beach;** from Fingal Picnic Area, the 3.5km (return trip) track leads through dense ti-tree to lookouts over Bass Strait. It's a steep track to Fingal Beach.
- **Coppins Track;** starting at Sorrento Ocean Beach and winding 2km along the clifftop to Jubilee Point.
- **Farnsworth Track;** this 1.2km track links London Bridge Car Park to Portsea Ocean Beach via 2 scenic lookouts.



- Drinking water is not available at all stops, please carry it with you.
- Litter is the visitors responsibility, please take it with you.
- Swimming at ocean beaches can be dangerous. Only swim at the patrolled beaches - Portsea, Sorrento & Gunnamatta.

- 1 Cape Schanck** - Cape Schanck is the southernmost point of the Mornington Peninsula. The Cape Schanck Lighthouse has served shipping since 1859. A boardwalk gives access to a pebble beach and spectacular scenery.
- 2 Fingal Picnic Area** - Enjoy a picnic in the delightful Fingal Picnic Area adjacent to Cape Schanck road. Walking tracks lead to lookouts with spectacular views of basalt cliff, and to Fingal Beach. The Fingal track is steep in places, it takes about 30mins each way. It's also best to visit the beach at low tide so you can readily explore the coast.
- 3 Gunnamatta Surf Beach**
- 4 Rye Ocean Beach**
- 5 Pearse's Beach**
- 6 Diamond Bay** - 1km from Jubilee Point. A small beach cove between Limestone cliffs.
- 7 Sorrento Ocean Beach** - Coppins lookout provides magnificent views .The Coppins Track walk starts from Coppins kiosk and leads you south east 1.5km to Jubilee Point. The track does continue through the National Park, passed Diamond Bay, to Marcia Ave in Rye - please contact Parks Victoria for a detailed map.
- 8 Portsea Ocean Beach**
- 9 London Bridge** - London Bridge is a coastal rock formation located at the western end of Portsea's Back Beach.
