



Two Bays

The Two Bays walking Track from Dromana, on Port Phillip Bay, to Bushrangers Bay near Cape Schanck, is the longest continuous walking track on the Mornington Peninsula. It stretches for 26kms.

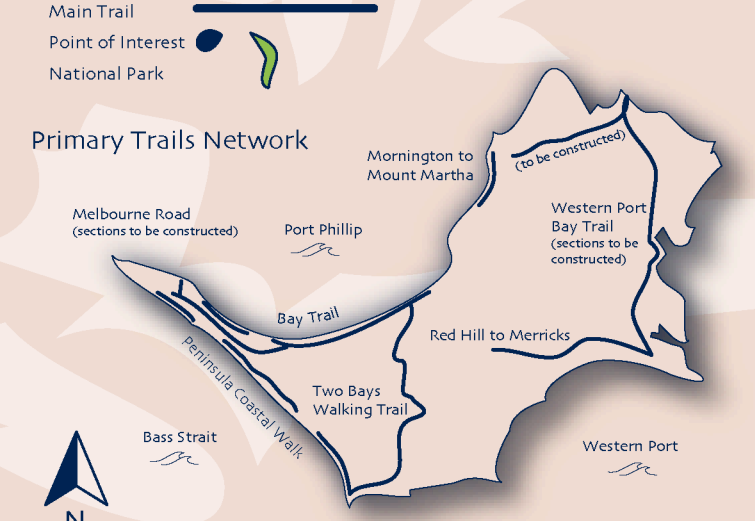
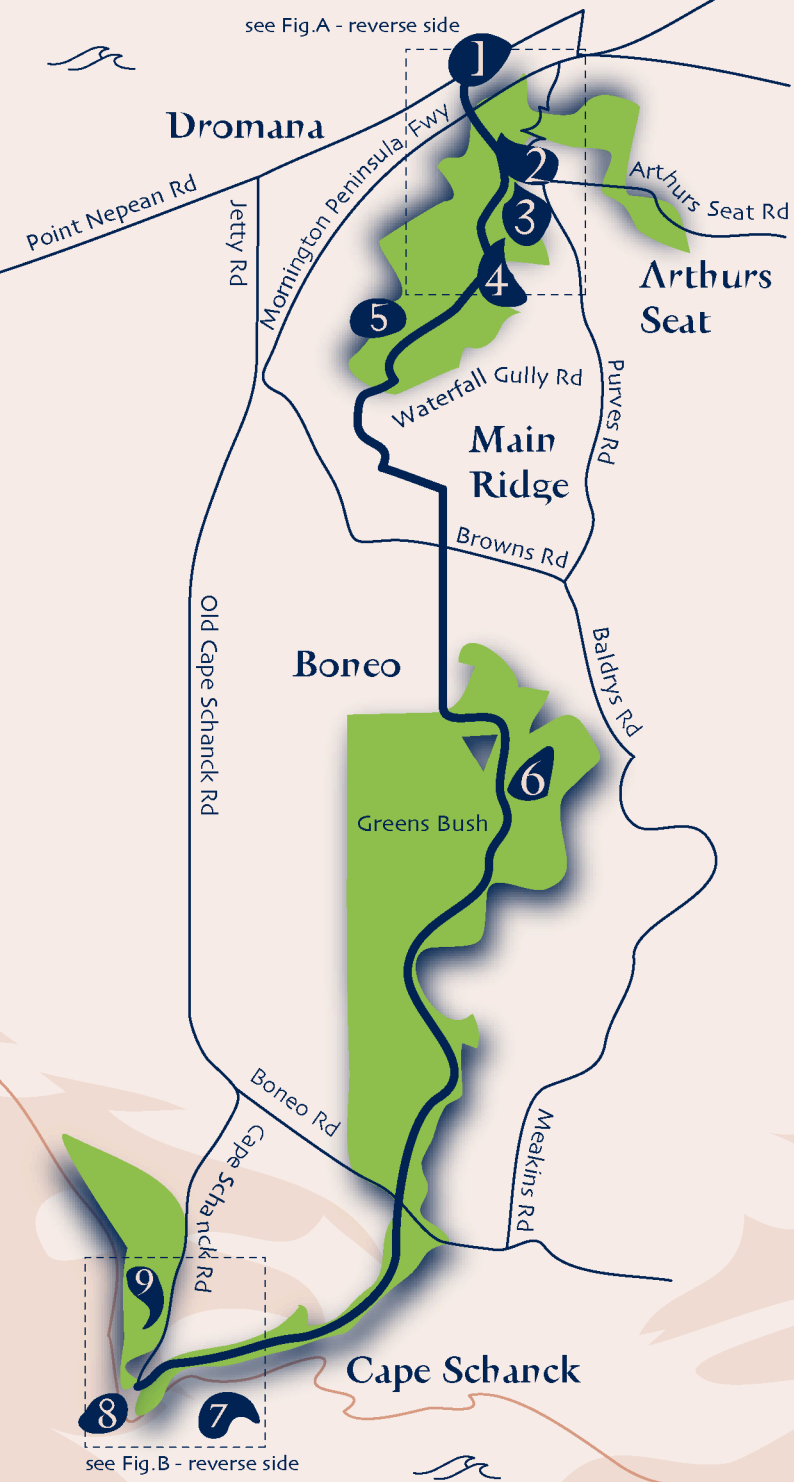
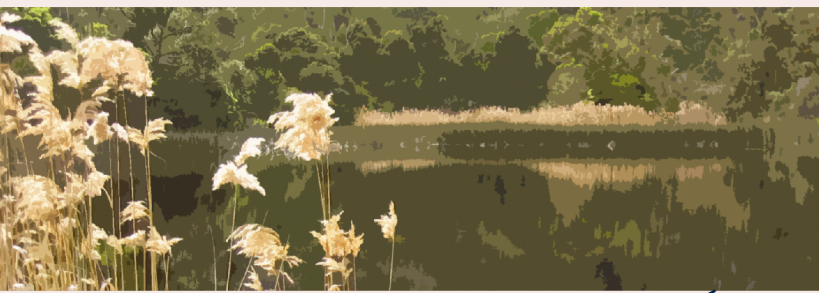
- This path is suitable for beginners, however it is steep around the Arthurs Seat area.

- Approximate time to walk this trail is 6hrs 30mins, visitors may wish to enjoy sections of the trail on different visits.
- The trail surface varies from crushed rock, dirt to grass, making this trail suitable for walkers only.

- Drinking water is not available at all stops, please carry it with you.

- Anthony's Nose** - McCrae nestles into the Arthurs Seat State Park between Dromana & Rosebud. Anthony's Nose, on the coast, breaks the pattern of coastal development between Dromana and McCrae.
- Arthurs Seat Lookout Tower, Lookout Hill Circuit Walk** - Starting at the end of Eaton's Cutting Road and weaving 1km through open sheoak woodland, pass through the stringybark forest to enjoy the magnificent views of Melbourne.
- Seawinds Garden** - Enjoy the scenic views of Port Phillip Bay and the Bellarine Peninsula from this popular picnic spot.
- TC McKellar Circuit Walk** - A gently sloping one kilometre walk through undulating bushland. Access is from Seawinds Gardens.
- Kings Falls Circuit Walk** - The falls, which flow most of the year, are on the southwestern slopes of Arthurs Seat. A small gravel carpark one kilometre along Waterfall Gully Road, is the start of a pleasant one-hour circuit walk through interesting bushland and a magnificent fern gully.
- Long Point Circuit** - Beginning at the intersection of Long Point Rd and Rogers Rd, this walk passes through eucalypt forest with a bracken understorey before opening out to give a view across grasslands and gullies of Coast Banksia and Blackwood.
- Bushrangers Bay** - Some of the best coastal scenery near Melbourne. The features seen along the track include rugged basalt cliffs and the delightful Main Creek at the end of the Bay.
- Cape Schanck Lighthouse**
This Lighthouse has served shipping since 1859.
- Fingal Picnic Area** - Enjoy a picnic in the delightful Fingal Picnic Area adjacent to Cape Schanck road. Walking tracks lead to lookouts with spectacular views of basalt cliff, and to Fingal Beach. The Fingal track is steep in places, it takes about 20mins each way.

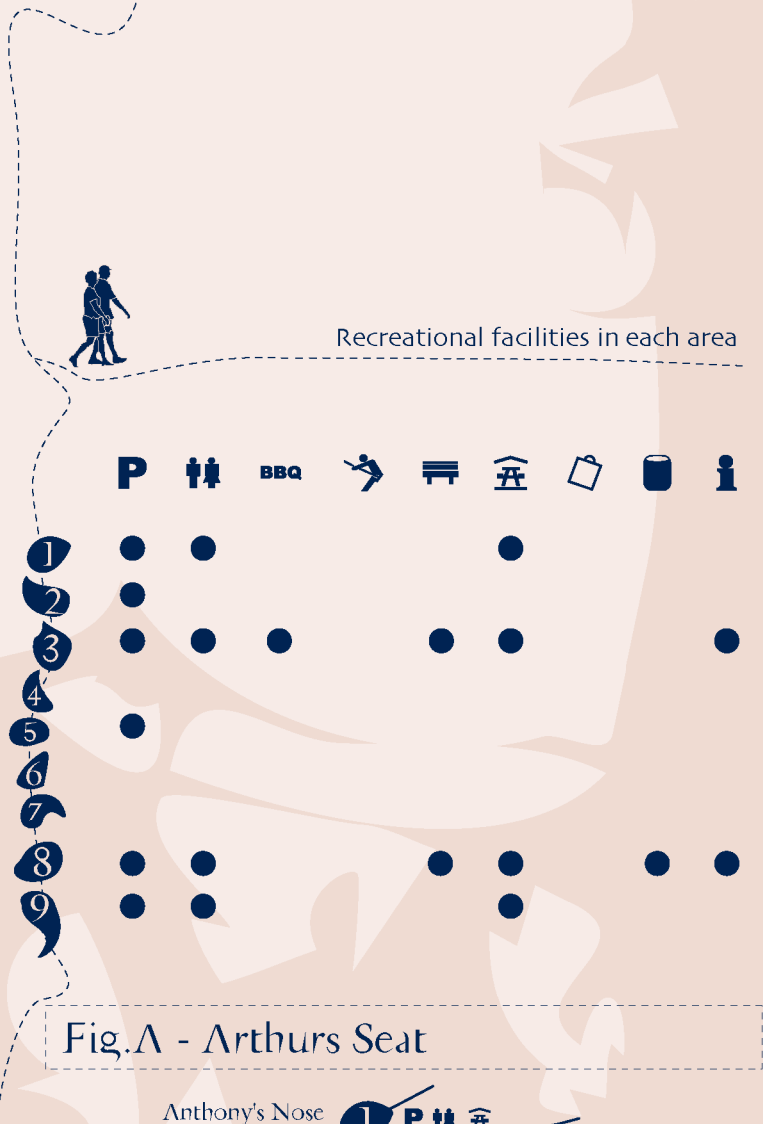


Fig.A - Arthurs Seat
